

# ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR ORDER ISSUED FOR

The ASBO is in force until 30<sup>th</sup> June 2011. This Order is to protect the people of Wakefield from further Anti-Social acts. If he breaches this order he risks arrest and imprisonment.

#### The Consequences:

The Courts have made an Anti-Social Behaviour Order (ASBO) which says he must not act in an anti-social manner within the Wakefield area.

#### The order bans him from:-

- 1 Engaging in conduct which causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to others or incite or encourage others to do so in Wakefield MDC area.
- 2 Engaging in conduct which is or is likely to be threatening, intimidating, abusive or insulting to others, or incite or encourage others to do so in WMDC area.
- 3 Entering the Englands Lane estate, Knottingley, as defined in red on the attached map.

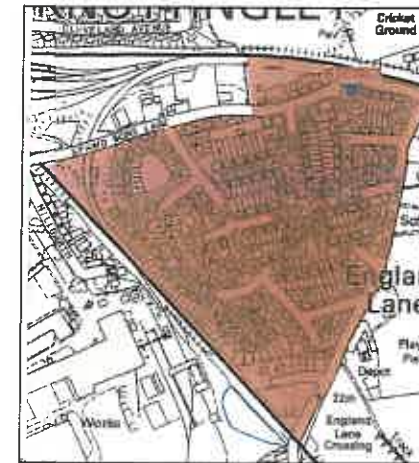
