Notes

The “All offences” figures represent the number of burglary dwelling offences which were crimed during the period 01/01/2013 – 30/09/2014 and were not subsequently no-crimed.

The “All offences by month” figures are based on the date they were first crimed.

The “Total value of property stolen” figure represents the total recorded value of all property records linked as STOLEN/TAKEN within the period. This figure does not relate exclusively to the value of items stolen from within the dwelling itself. For example, a significant proportion

represents the value of vehicles stolen in the course of Burglary Dwelling offences (often referred to as 'Car key' or 'Hanoi' burglaries), and the value of property contained within them at the time they were stolen.

The "All Offences by District" figures are based on the "District" element of the crime location for all offences within the period.

The "Top 3 Towns" figures are based on the "Town" element of the crime location for all offences within the period.

The "Top 3 Wards" figures are based on the "Ward" element of the crime location for all offences within the period.

The "Building Type" figures are based on data contained within the crime MO (Modus Operandi) for all offences within the period.

Crime classifications are based on Home Office Counting Rules for recorded crime which may be viewed via the following link:
